## METHODOLOGY

The survey was conducted online with 1,650 Canadian residents aged 18 and over from October $24^{\text {th }}$ to $29^{\text {th }}, 2018$. A random sample of panelists were invited to complete the survey from a set of partner panels based on the Lucid exchange platform. These partners are typically double opt-in survey panels, blended to manage out potential skews in the data from a single source.

The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched
Canada's population according to age, gender, educational attainment, and region. Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

$\checkmark 7$ in 10 Canadians feel that the federal government should make investing in and optimizing Canada's health care system to respond to its aging population a top or very high priority.

- More feel this way than other issues the country is facing including the rising cost of housing, public debt and deficits, climate change, rising global extremism, or economic and employment disruption.
$\checkmark$ Canadians in all regions and provinces, both men and women and clear majorities across age groups think preparing the health care system for an aging population should be a top or very high priority.
$\checkmark$ There is broad public support for all the HEAL proposals tested.
